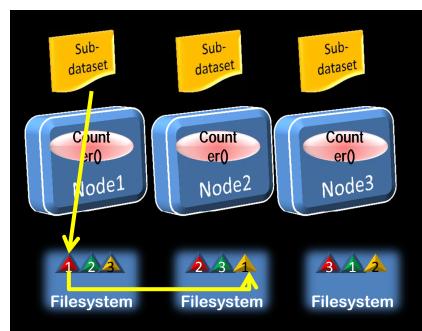


Hadoop Distributed Filesystem (HDFS)



Comparison with RAC

- Not shared storage
- Data is discrete
- Version control not required
- Concurrency not required
- Transactional integrity across nodes not required



Advantages of Hadoop

- Processors need not be super-fast
- Immensely scalable
- Storage is redundant by design
- No RAID level required

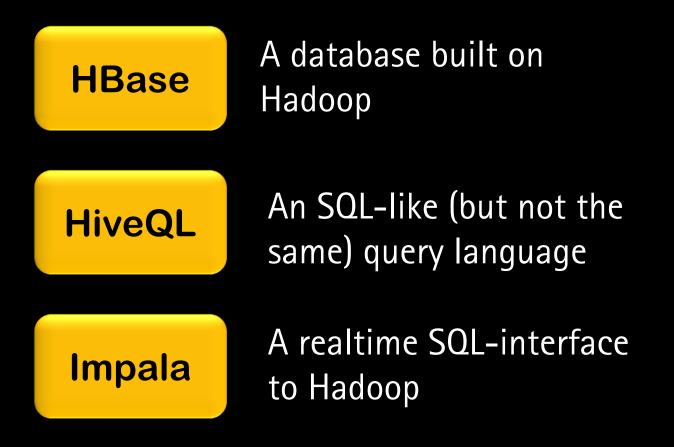
